AT THE LAST LUNCHEON ON MAY 21, PPB honored the Queen of Las Vegas “swing,” **KEELY SMITH**. As one of the last living members of the great Rat Pack era of the 1950s and '60s, **KEELY** has thrilled audiences on stage and in her numerous recordings. Along with her partner, Louis Prima, the duo changed Las Vegas entertainment forever with her sexy, sultry voice and his wild antics and they're probably best known for “That Ol' Black Magic,” “I've Got You Under My Skin” and “Bei Mir Bist Du Schoen.” **KEELY**'s had a successful solo recording career with partners Billy May and Nelson Riddle.

In 2008, the Academy of Television Arts and Sciences inducted her into their Golden Circle to commemorate 50 years of service to the TV and broadcast industry.

Joining **KEELY** on the dais were Past President **CHUCK SOUTHCOTT** and Entertainment Chair **JEANNE DeVIVIER BROWN**, resident humorist **HAL KANTER**, along with **WINK MARTINDALE**, **SANDY MARTINDALE**, **MARILYN KING**, **JERRY SHARELL**, President of the Society of Singers and Music Producer **MORRIS DIAMOND**.

IN PRESENTING THE DIAMOND CIRCLE AWARD, CHRISTOPHER THOMAS said: “Today's honoree is a Producer, Director of Programming, Writer and Announcer. He serves PPB as a Board Member, Website Manager and Audio Historian. His extraordinary career started in the third grade as an actor in a play broadcast on KGA in Spokane, Wash. He earned a degree in Speech and Drama from Whitman College and the NBC Radio and TV Institute. He worked for over three decades for the Armed Forces Radio and Television Service in Panama, the Pentagon and in Hollywood supervising programming for 400 radio and 40 TV military outlets during his last 14 years in Hollywood. As a result of his outstanding efforts, our honoree was awarded the Navy's Superior Civilian Service Medal after serving as Assistant Director of The Navy Broadcasting Service in the Pentagon.
